WHAT WE DO



SUCCESS STORY









Leveraging the trust established within the community, VNDC initiated a comprehensive renovation of Mrs. Ibrahim's home. **FCT** collaborating with the Mandate Secretary, Mrs. Dayo. This project addressed vital elements such as ceilings, flooring, screeding, and painting. In addition to the renovation, Mrs. Ibrahim received customized package containing essential household items, including a fan, mattress, mosquito net, insecticides, and bags.

This undertaking not only showcases VNDC's commitment to meeting the immediate needs of vulnerable individuals but also contributes to fostering a community resilient to gender-based violence. The meticulous technical and logistical execution of these efforts serves as a testament to the trust forming the bedrock of VNDC's impactful initiatives within communities.

OUR **PROJECTS**

The Vaccine Network for Disease Control (VNDC) recognizes the interconnectedness of issues that affect sustainable health and development. We therefore, bring to bear the unique approaches of achieving community health outcomes through a lineup of intentional interventions. The path to self-reliance is to accelerate individuals and communities to a level of sustained development through standard development indicators, community profiling systems, and community adoption strategies.

PREACH PROJECT

VNDC is working with Global Health Advocacy Incubator (GHAI) on a Gavi funded project - Partnership to Reach Zero-Dose Children (PREACH) Project. The goal of the project is to redeem, expand and sustain multi-stakeholder commitment to investment in immunization and primary healthcare to reach zero-dose children and increase immunization coverage in Nigeria. Through this project, VNDC will advocate for increased domestic resource mobilization for immunization and PHC; timely release of budgetary allocation to immunization especially Gavi co-financing; and advocate for effective allocation, use and accountability of resources. Through engagement with the sub-



national stakeholders, the governors, using the Nigeria Governors' Forum (NGF), VNDC has proposed effective strategies to increase domestic financing of immunization, immunization delivery systems and strengthen PHC at the primary health facilities.



AGENCY FOR ALL .

As the dissemination consultant for the USAID-funded Agency4All mission, VNDC played a crucial role in bolstering COVID-19 vaccine uptake in Nigeria. The initiative began with strategic stakeholder engagements, fostering collaboration and laying a solid foundation for subsequent efforts. These included a radio interview with a live audience, a targeted Twitter X-Chat discourse addressing youth concerns, and a validation meeting with the FCT-Primary Health Care Board to align strategies with healthcare professionals and policymakers. VNDC also organized a meaningful in-person dissemination event and launched a comprehensive campaign advocating for integrated life course immunization approaches. The project reached its pinnacle with a global webinar sharing insights on tackling vaccine hesitancy, show-

casing VNDC's adaptability and dedication to positively influencing public health in the face of a global crisis. Throughout these varied but interconnected activities, VNDC successfully reached and adapted to a wide array of audiences, reflecting our enduring commitment to learning, adapting, and positively influencing public health strategies in the challenging context of a global health crisis.

GLOW CLUB

VNDC is working with GLOBAL GLOW to provide girls with out-of-school safe spaces to learn and explore, and with trusted and knowledgeable mentors to help them discover new techniques for advocacy, self-empowerment, and skillbuilding. We believe that when girls are strong, healthy, and educated, they change their communities and transform societies.

Since the initiation of our club activities in March 2023, encompassing Bright Girls Club, Unique Girls Club, Girl's Encouragers' Club, Flabbergasting Girl's Club, and Diamond Girls Club, we have connected with an average of 120 girls aged 11-17 in the Federal Capital Territory (FCT) and Warri, Delta state.

SPEED PROJECT


We are currently implementing a U.S. Government PEPFAR/CDC funded project on HIV/AIDS/TB through the Excellence Community Education Welfare Scheme (ECEWS) project tagged "Sustainable Programs for HIV Epidemic Control and Equitable Service Delivery (SPEED)" in Delta State. We have enrolled and are serving 7,882 orphans and vulnerable children across four local government areas within this project. Here, we have conducted HIV risk assessment for over 5,988 individuals, conducted strategic sensitizations on HIV prevention, SRHR, PMTCT Condom education Adolescent care and treatment services.

and contributed to increased viral suppression. In our HIV programming, implementation efficiency is ensured through the creation of Service Care Plans for every beneficiary (family) to facilitate effective progress monitoring, utilization of the NOMIS, NDR software for monitoring and tracking update, upload, and analysis of data.

HPV Vaccine Introduction Mobilization Project

VNDC in collaboration with WAVA and DCL implemented a GAVI funded project to facilitate the introduction of HPV vaccine as a 1-dose regimen for girls aged 9-14 years in AMAC LGA. FCT.

VNDC executed a comprehensive training initiative to promote the adoption of the HPV vaccine in FCT, employing the CHIPS strategy to effectively train, advocate for and promote the uptake of the HPV vaccine across 10 wards in the AMAC LGA. Initially, VNDC raised awareness and mobilized 10 key vaccine champions in each ward. Subsequently, these primary champions underwent additional training to effectively enlist and empower 5 community-based champions in diverse settlements. This strategic approach significantly expanded the network, resulting in a total of 50 committed vaccine champions throughout the region.





Social Media Campaign for Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis (PrEP) Project

The Vaccine Network for Disease Control (VNDC) is actively involved in consulting for the Institute of Human Virology Nigeria (IHVN) and the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) to implement a targeted social media campaign focused on promoting awareness about the effectiveness of Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis (PrEP) in preventing HIV transmission. PrEP is considered a groundbreaking medical strategy designed to reduce the risk of contracting HIV among individuals at high risk of exposure. VNDC's efforts aim to leverage social media platforms to disseminate crucial dispel myths, information. and encourage individuals at risk to consider and adopt PrEP as a preventive measure. Through this collaborative initiative. VNDC contributes to the broader public health goal of reducing HIV transmission and promoting overall well-being within communities.

Health Security Project

The Health Security Project, funded by the Africa Health Budget Network (AHBN) and undertaken in partnership with HERFON & GEMHUB, is a pivotal initiative aimed at reinforcing health security in the region. VNDC collaborates closely with the Nigeria Center for Disease Control (NCDC) to realize this project's overarching goal: to fortify health security by enhancing accountable transparent and health finance management and ensuring equitable access to vaccines.

At the heart of this project is a commitment to bolster accountability and augment financing from domestic resources. This approach is anticipated to significantly improve disease surveillance capabilities and the response efficiency to



disease outbreaks. By focusing on these key areas, the Health Security Project aims to establish a more robust and resilient health infrastructure, capable of effectively managing current challenges and preemptively addressing future health crises. The collaboration between VNDC, HERFON, GEMHUB, and NCDC under the auspices of AHBN is a testament to the collective effort required to achieve sustainable improvements in health security and pandemic preparedness.



WASH PROJECT, DAMAGAZA

Vaccine Network for Disease Control spearheaded an impactful WASH program in Damagaza Community, FCT, as part of its commitment to bolster community health. The multifaceted program incorporated a communitywide cleaning initiative, providing a cleaner and healthier environment. **VNDC** also facilitated medical interventions, conducting malaria testing and distributing drugs to address prevalent health concerns. As part of the holistic approach, we distributed food, addressing not only immediate health needs but also contributing to community well-being.

An innovative element of the program was the interhouse cleaning competition, instilling a sense of community pride and responsibility. The competition not only motivated residents to actively participate in maintaining cleanliness but also created a healthy community spirit. As a commendable initiative, VNDC awarded monetary gifts to the top three cleanest houses, recognizing and reinforcing the positive impact of collective efforts.
